

MINUTES OF MEETING OF EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE  
ALABAMA ASSOCIATION OF FUTURE FARMERS OF AMERICA

Auburn, Alabama  
July 12, 1934, 8:00 a. m.

The Executive Committee meeting was called to order by the President, Austin Ezzell, at 8:00 a. m. in the agricultural class room of the Lee County High School. The first order of business was a discussion of the program for the annual meeting. Final plans were made for each item.

Mr. Cammack stated that in view of the work he would have during the coming year he would need assistance as State Adviser. The matter was discussed by the Committee and it was decided that Mr. P. C. Brook would be appointed Assistant State Adviser.

Mr. Cannon suggested that the State Association take care of the expenses of the picture show scheduled for 9:00 o'clock Thursday night. The President put the matter to a vote and it was unanimously decided that the Association would take care of this amount.

Mr. Cammack announced that Mr. M. H. Pearson, Educational Director of the Chilean Nitrate of Soda Educational Bureau, desired to appear on the program to submit to the Association a plan for another essay contest next year and to award a fountain pen to each boy who participated in the contest this year. Arrangements were made for Mr. Pearson to appear on the program at 7:30 Thursday night.

The matter of the selection of honorary State Farmers was then discussed. The President requested the State Supervisors to confer with a view to recommending for this degree several teachers of vocational agriculture who had done outstanding work with their F. F.
