It has been a whirlwind of a summer since the close of the 89th Alabama FFA State Convention. Our state officer team has participated in numerous events representing Alabama FFA throughout June and July. Recently, Vice-President John Crawford and I returned from the State Presidents' Conference (SPC). This is the third experience in the state FFA officer training series. SPC is an advanced leadership training that builds on the first two components of the state FFA officer leadership continuum, Blast Off and NLCSO. The 2017 State Presidents' Conference was held July 24-29, 2017 at the Hilton Crystal City in Arlington, Va. At State Presidents' Conference, two officers from each state association travel to Washington, D.C. to begin the delegate committee process and share ideas among all state FFA associations. Against the backdrop of our nation's capital, state officers also learn the importance of advocacy by "telling their story" of agriculture, agricultural education, career technical education, and FFA.

We worked long days at SPC, but also found time to connect with our nation's rich history and fellow FFA officers. On Monday and Tuesday, we learned about advocacy and

lobbying. We heard delegate proposals and began determining which proposals would become the framework for committee discussions at the 90th National FFA Convention and Expo. On Wednesday, we started the day with a breakfast at the USDA where we witnessed the signing of a memorandum of understanding by USDA Secretary of Agriculture Sonny Perdue and National FFA CEO Mark Poeschl to support the youth and prepare tomorrow's agricultural workforce. Wednesday afternoon was spent on Capitol Hill lobbying for H.R. 1626 - Agriculture Student Protection Act and S. 671 -Agriculture Student EARN (Encourage, Acknowledge, Reward, Nurture) Act. John and I had the pleasure of lobbying in the offices of Alabama Representatives Martha Roby, Mike Rogers, and Terri Sewell. We also met with Alabama Senators Richard Shelby and Luther Strange. Between visiting with lawmakers, we sat in on a meeting of the House Ag Committee. On Thursday, our work continued and committees for national convention were announced. The evening was filled with a night tour of historical sites including the WWII Monument, Lincoln Memorial, Vietnam Wall, Korean War Monument, and memorials for Franklin D. Roosevelt, Martin Luther King Jr., and Thomas Jefferson. Committee work concluded on Friday before we were released to explore D.C. on our own. John and I visited the Holocaust Museum, Library of Congress, and the Smithsonian with our friends from Arkansas and Georgia. We


Ready Set Go

FFA/USDA Agreement

During the 2017 State Presidents' Conference D.C. Alumni Breakfast at the U.S. Department of Agriculture, National FFA CEO Mark Poeschl and U.S. Secretary of Agriculture Sonny Perdue announced a new partnership. The two signed a Memorandum of Understanding on July 26th wishing to create a relationship between the USDA and FFA. Under the MOU, they will collaborate on both long and short term initiatives to promote and prepare the youth, connect them with chances in agriculture, food, and natural resources systems, and to grow appreciation for importance of agriculture.

Mark Poeschl had this to say on the agreement: "At National FFA, we are preparing our students to be tomorrow's leaders in agriculture," "Through this MOU, USDA helps us continue our vision of growing leaders, building communities and strengthening agriculture. We look forward to our partnership and the ability to share our ideas with USDA."

Implementation of the memorandum will occur at the national levels of USDA and FFA. They both will work together to create an annual plan of work as it relates to these terms, and develop a reporting system that reflects the effectiveness and impact of the partnership between the parties. The U.S. Department of Agriculture will recognize the importance of school-based agricultural education and youth-serving organizations in motivating and preparing young people to pursue careers in the agriculture, food, and natural resources systems. And the FFA will Work with USDA to attract, educate, inspire, and prepare students to enter careers in the agriculture, food, and natural resources

With many members of the Alabama FFA being recognized, the 89th annual Alabama FFA State Convention was a huge success! The convention was held at the Montgomery Renaissance and Montgomery Performing Arts Centre on June 7-9. On June 6th the career development event competitions were held at Auburn University, and on Wednesday the first session was held and the state officer interview process began. During the convention sessions, keynote speeches and retiring addresses are given. Wednesday and Thursday, the career show was open to all members to get a glimpse of the agricultural industry, as well as workshops held by past Alabama state officer and national officer candidate from the Enterprise chapter, Jordan Stowe, and National FFA president from Delaware, David Townsend. During the third general session Thursday afternoon, CDE and LDE award recipients were recognized, a few outstanding award winners were the Brantley chapter placing 2nd in the Creed Speaking LDE; 2nd in the Conduct a Chapter Meeting LDE; and 3rd in the Forestry CDE. The Enterprise chapter will be representing Alabama at national convention in the Parliamentary Procedure LDE and in the Conduct a Chapter Meeting LDE. The Foley chapter placed second in the poultry CDE, but will be representing Alabama at national convention in the veterinary science CDE. Members were also recognized for their

achievements in their Supervised Agricultural Experience projects by receiving proficiency awards. Thursday morning, Mr. Keith Richards, Founder of Taziki's, gave a keynote speech. The final session was held Friday morning. It was during this session that 76 members from the south district were awarded their state FFA degrees; then the moment came to elect a new slate of state officers for 2017- 2018. Cameron Catrett, 2016-17 South District President was elected this year's state president and Bryce Hendricks, 2016-17 South District Vice-President was elected this year's state sentinel.
