#### **CRIME PREVENTION**

#### PURPOSE

To assist FFA chapters in taking an active role in crime prevention in the home and community. Yearly FBI statistics show that crime is increasing in both urban and rural areas; the most prevalent being crimes against property (vandalism, theft, and burglary). Through the FFA Chapter Crime Prevention Award Program, FFA chapters have an opportunity to help law enforcement fight crime by becoming involved and participating in local community crime prevention projects and activities.

#### **ELIGIBILITY AND REGULATIONS**

Participation is open to all FFA Chapters in good standing. To be eligible for this award, Forms 1 and 2 of the Crime Prevention Award application must be received by the Executive Secretary by the due date on the FFA calendar found at www.alabamaffa.org. Application may be sent electronically by email.

Form 2 of this application may also be filled out utilizing the National Chapter Award form 2 format instead of the application below. Chapters are required to submit three activities as part of their Crime Prevention Program. If using form 2 of the National Chapter Award, please submit a form for each activity totaling 3 forms.

The majority of activities selected for this award area should relate directly to the prevention of crime in rural, agricultural communities and address the direct needs of the community.

#### **SCORING**

Applications will be scored based on the rubric and scoresheet provided. Each applying chapter should choose three activities from their Crime Prevention Program to include. You should submit either form 2 of this application or form 2 of the National Chapter Award format for each of your three activities. The maximum points available is 900 points.

#### STATE/DISTRICT AWARDS

A chapter banner will be awarded to the top award application in each district. The top four overall applications will be awarded at the state level. These chapters will receive:

First Place \$300.00 and chapter banner Second Place \$200.00 and chapter banner Third Place \$150.00 and chapter banner Fourth Place \$100.00 and chapter banner
