- 1. Open to Alabama 4-H online members who are enrolled in a Dairy program.
 - Junior and Senior enrollment <u>must be completed</u> on 4-H online for "4-H Dairy Contests" prior to <u>SEPTEMBER 17, 2021</u>
 *For 2021, registration (for teams) must be, completed by <u>September 17, 2021</u>.

* Coaches are to submit a list of a 4-member team and 2 alternates, or a 3-member team. Final team makeup will be announced by the coach at check-in on the day of the contest. Team members must be pulled from the list submitted.

- 2. Quiz Bowl competition is for **teams only**. Teams shall consist of a minimum of 3 and a maximum of 4 members. Counties are encouraged to have a 4-person team.
- 3. There are no limitations on number of teams from a county or club for Seniors & Juniors. A coach can turn in a team of 4 members and 2 alternates or a 3-member team. Final team makeup will be announced by the coach at check-in on the day of the contest. Team members must be pulled from the list submitted. If a county does not have enough interested 4-H'ers to make a team, they can reach out to 4-H'ers in other counties to make up a team.
- 4. <u>Any</u> violation of the above and following rules is grounds for disqualification.
 - All forms and use of tobacco and illegal substances is prohibited.
 - The use of cell phones is prohibited.

- 5. There will be one State Contest for each age group.
 - Contestants must be between the ages of 9-13 <u>before</u> December 31st of the year of the contest to compete as a **Junior**.
 - Contestants must be between the ages of 14-19 <u>before</u> Jan 1st of the year of the contest to compete as a **Senior**.
- 6. The winning **Senior** team may travel and represent Alabama at an approved national contest.
 - The State Extension Dairy Team and the State 4-H Office must approve this contest.
 - A pre-approved chaperone must attend the contest with the team.
 - o 1 male chaperone: 8 males
 - o 1 female chaperone: 8 females
 - Some funds may be available to assist with trip costs.
- 7. The Second Place team may represent Alabama at a regional contest, but **<u>no funds will be</u>**

provided. <u>The State Extension Dairy Team and the State 4-H Office must approve this</u> <u>contest.</u>

- 2. There will be 3 Phases (A, B, C) to the Senior Dairy Quiz Bowl Contest
- 3. <u>Phase A</u>: EXAM: Four contestants per team will take a 25 question exam each question is worth 1 point. This exam will be used in the overall score and will help us seed teams in the correct bracket for "phase C".

Phase B: TEAM QUESTIONS: Each team will be asked five questions separately. Answers are to be given by the team captain, but assistance from other team members is allowed. Correct responses are worth 10 points. A question may only be repeated once. Answers must be started within 20 seconds after question has been read and completed within an additional 60 seconds. Partial credit may be given at the discretion of the judge(s). After one team has been questioned, the other team will enter the contest room and be asked the same five questions. Teams are competing for points not against other teams.

Phase C: TOSS-UP ROUNDS: double elimination!

Each round consists of 20 toss-up questions and a possibility of 6 bonus questions.

- Each team must have a team captain.
- There will be <u>NO</u> multiple choice or True/False questions.
- Coaches for each team are the official scorekeepers. Coaches will notify question-reader when their team has qualified for a bonus question.

- Correct toss up answers are worth 15 points and bonus 20 points.
- Any team member may buzz in to answer a toss-up question. However, there will be no discussion among teammates.
- Team members will have 10 seconds from the last word of the question being read to buzz in and must start their answer within 5 seconds. If no team member buzzes in within the 10 seconds the moderator will read the answer and the question will be dropped and neither team will lose points.
- When a signal is pushed before the question has been completely read, the moderator will stop reading the question. After being acknowledged, by the moderator, the contestant may answer the question. If correct, the team will receive credit, (judges may not ask for an explanation). If the answer is incorrect, the question will be completely reread and members of the team will have an opportunity to answer it.
- If any team member buzzes in and provides no answer, **<u>10 points</u>** are deducted.
- If any team member buzzes in and provides an answer before he or she is recognized, by the moderator, then <u>10 points</u> will be deducted.
- If a member of one team buzzes in and provides an incorrect answer, no points will be deducted.
 - Members of the opposing team will be given a chance to answer, once recognized they can answer the question immediately with or without having the question reread.
- If by mistake the moderator gives the correct answer after the first team buzzes in and answers incorrectly, but before the opposing team has the opportunity to answer the question, a new question will be asked only to the second team to correct the mistake.
- NO partial credit is given in Phase C, except for bonus questions.
- Answers and interpretations of questions will be the sole responsibility and final recall of the judge(s). A team member will have the privilege to ask the judge(s) to verify an answer that he/she feels correct. If a coach challenges the judge(s) decision, the coach must call a "time out" (2 timeouts are allowed each team per round) immediately (before the next question has been started to be read). A decision made by the judge(s) after the answer will be final.

Bonus Questions:

- Note: ONLY the team captain may buzz in and give their collective answer.
- Coaches are responsible for notifying judges when bonuses should be given.
- To receive a bonus, three out of the four team members must answer a toss-up question correctly.
- The team that qualified for the bonus question is the only team that can receive points. If the team gives an incorrect answer, the opposing team will not have an opportunity to receive any points.
- The only discussion allowed between team members will be on bonus questions and in Phase B.
- Only the number of answers required by the bonus question will be accepted. Example: If the bonus has a four-part answer, the first four answers given by the team captain will be accepted. The bonus answers must be started within 20 seconds and completed within an additional 60 seconds.
- For bonus questions, team members may talk amongst themselves and discuss the answer, <u>but</u> <u>only the designated team captain may answer the question.</u>

Contest Results:

- The winning team will be determined by the highest total score from Phases A, B and C. In the event of a tie, the two teams will be asked 5 additional Phase C questions, no bonus questions will be asked during a tie breaker.
- No electronic devices will be allowed.
- Any questions or areas not covered by these rules will be decided by the 4-H Dairy Bowl Committee (which will be announced before the contest). All decisions by this committee are final!

*Toss-ups are multiple choice, usually with four options. Options are not necessarily designated A, B, C, or D.

- Correct answers are worth 10 points. Incorrect answers bear no penalty.
- Anyone may buzz in to answer a toss-up question, but there will be no discussion among teammates.
- Team members will have 5 seconds from the last word of the question and choices to buzz in.
- If a member of one team buzzes in and provides an incorrect answer, no points will be deducted.
 - Members of the opposing team can answer the question immediately with or without having the question reread.
 - If by mistake the moderator gives the correct answer after the first team buzzes in and answers incorrectly, but before the opposing team has the opportunity to answer the question, a new question will be asked only to the second team to correct the mistake.
