HORSE EVALUATION CAREER DEVELOPMENT EVENT

PURPOSE

The purpose of the FFA Horse Evaluation Career Development Event is to stimulate the study of and interest in equine science selection, management, and production through the Agriscience Education curriculum.

ELIGIBILITY AND REGULATIONS

- For specific eligibility of participants, refer to the Contests and Awards Booklet.
- Teams will report directly to the district event. The top four winning teams in the North, Central and South districts will compete in the state finals.
- If a cell phone or smart watch is seen or heard in the possession of a competitor, that individual student will be disqualified from competition and receive a score of zero.
- Competitors must enter their first and last name as well as their chapter number and name on the scorecard or they will receive a score of zero. Judges will not attempt to figure out who the card belongs to.
- Scantrons cards that are incorrectly completed (i.e. chapter numbers are not correctly shaded in, stray marks, etc.) will not be scored thus receiving a score of zero.
- The team will consist of a maximum of four members. The team's total score will be based on the sum of the points earned by the three highest scoring participants on the team.
- All materials needed for this event will be furnished. Bringing a clipboard is encouraged.
- All tack and attire are legal in the selection of classes.

DISCLAIMER

If contests (CDE, LDE, TDEs) cannot be held in person, a virtual option may be conducted. Contest rules and guidelines are subject to change to meet the needs of a virtual experience.

DRESS CODE

Participants must wear closed toed shoes/boots (no sandals, crocs or slides) and long pants (jeans with no holes/ khakis/dress pants) or skirts (for religious reasons) that cover the knees if not in official dress. Leggings, jogging pants, yoga, lycra, are not permitted. Shirts should be long enough to be tucked in (no crop tops or midriff showing) and not contain vulgar or suggestive material or language. Contest where oral reasons are given should respect the professionalism of the event, and dress aligning with the profession is preferred. Official FFA Dress is an allowable form of

dress for all events. Consequences for not being in dress code will result in disqualification, and the participant will not be allowed to compete.

ALTERNATE POLICY

For district level events, if a chapter brings alternates there will be no more than two alternates allowed per team. Alternates will use a copy of the scan form (not an original) for those events scored via judgingcard.com. If more than four official scan forms are turned in for a chapter in one event, the highest score(s) for that team will be disqualified and deleted until the chapter only has four team members in the scoring system. Alternates must not be in groups with official team members.

For state level events, alternates are not allowed.

DISTRICT EVENT

The district event will consist of:

Written Exam 50 questions (2 points each) for a total of 100 points.

Identification class with 25 items (participants will identify breeds and/or colors and markings of horses, tack and equipment as well as leg deviations (i.e. toed out, toed in, sickle hocked, etc., items.) Each problem will be worth 3 points each for a total of 75 points. Identification list may be found on page 7.

Placing Classes There will be 2 halter classes (selected by Auburn Staff and can be any breed, example: 4 quarter type mares, 4 hunter type geldings,) They will be presented by colored pictures printed. 50 pts each for a total of 100 pts.

<u>**Time**</u> 70 minutes will be given to complete the Written Exam, the Identification Class, and the two placing classes.

STATE EVENT

The state event will consist of the following classes/activities. However, the number and type of classes/activities included in the state event is subject to change dependent upon the availability of animals.

Four classes will be judged consisting of two halter classes and two performance classes.

HALTER CLASSES

Halter classes may be represented by the following breeds: Quarter Horse, Conformation Hunter, Appaloosa, Paint, American Saddle Bred, and Morgan. All halter classes will be judged as sound.

PERFORMANCE CLASSES

Performance classes may include Western Horsemanship, Hunt Seat Equitation, Western Pleasure, Ranch Pleasure, Western Riding, Reining, English Pleasure (Saddle Seat), Hunter Under Saddle (Hunt Seat), Trail and Hunter Hack. Performance classes will be judged as they go in regard to soundness. AQHA rules will be used in regard to head set and head carriage.

ORAL REASONS

There will be two sets of oral reasons. One set on a halter class and one set on performance class. Notes are not to be used on oral reasons.

IDENTIFICATION CLASS

Participants will identify breeds and/or colors, markings of horses, tack and equipment as well as leg deviations (i.e. toed out, toed in, sickle hocked, etc.) and items related to the horse anatomy. Each problem will be worth two points each, 25 items total. Identification list may be found on page 7.

WRITTEN EXAMINATION

A multiple-choice exam will be given. The objective exam is designed to determine team members understanding of the equine industry. The exam will consist of 50 multiple choice questions.

<u>Time</u> 1 hour will be given to complete the Written Exam and the Identification Class.

SCORING

The possible points for each class/activity in the state event are listed below.
